Course Description

PEHR 1210 is designed to provide students with a progressive sequence of skills and activities designed to offer a basic understanding in Volleyball. Game strategies, techniques, terminology, rules and safety will be covered in this class. Students will participate in organized games and skill competitions against classmates as well as learn skills to increase individual volleyball ability.

Course Description

1. Learn to develop and increase volleyball skill and abilities
2. Understand rules and regulations of volleyball
3. Gain a greater respect for the game of volleyball
4. Complete outside the classroom projects for understanding volleyball's importance in an athletic community
5. Learn how to succeed in a volleyball game setting atmosphere

Required Materials

There will be no required textbooks for this course. Proper attire (athletic clothes, shoes, etc.) will be required for participation in this class.

Grading Criteria

1. Attendance: 5 points per day, 150 points total. Students are expected to be on time to class.
2. Assignment: One out of class assignment will be given out. The assignment will be worth 25 points and will be due the final day of class. Assignment turned in late (except for an excused absence) will be deducted points for each class day it is late. Assignments will not be accepted 15 days past the due date and the student will receive a "0" on the assignment.
3. Final Exam: 25 Points
4. Total of 200 points
5. Any student who has 100% attendance at the end of the semester will not be required to take the final exam.

Letter grades will be assigned based on % of points earned on the scale shown below:

A grade of “incomplete” will only be given in circumstances where a student has been doing well in the class but has a difficulty such as serious illness during the last week or two of the semester.
